- 1600: **"From the Rock to the Island"**. Join festival musicians for songs of the sea.

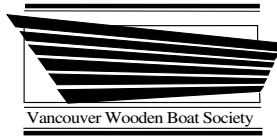
Sunday, August 29

- 1430: **"Music to launch your boat"**: Music to warm your hearts and "launch your boats bye" in Market Courtyard.

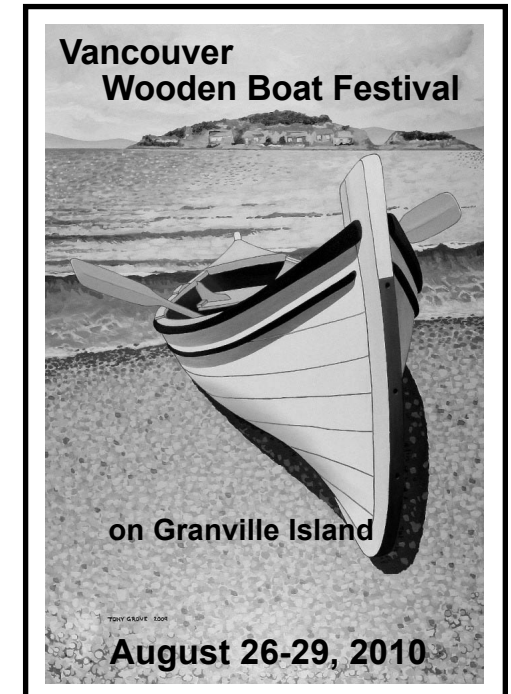

Most events and activities run throughout the day but impromptu and unexpected maritime madness could occur anywhere at any time!

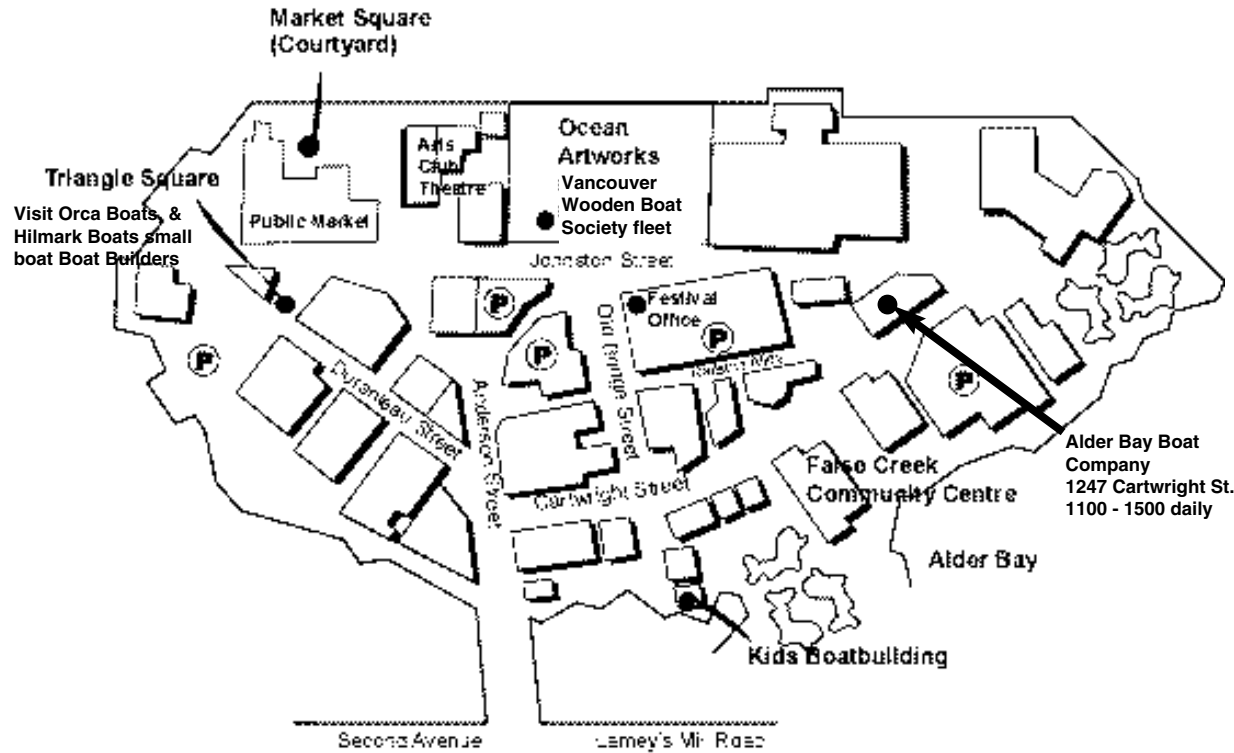

BC Viking Ship Society, Vancouver, BC – join society members with *Munin*, the 40’ - 1/2 scale model of a Viking ship powered by oars and sail. If you are lucky you will get to be a part of a rollicking raid - viking style.

Britannia Heritage Shipyard National Historic Site, Richmond, BC – society members will present a glimpse into the past of shipbuilding in Steveston on board the *Silver Ann & Merilee II*
